Sep. 15: A balanced scoring attack and another strong game by rookie goalkeeper Taylor Guest helped Nottingham's boys' soccer team to a 4-1 victory over visiting West Windsor-Plainsboro South today.

Four different players scored for Nottingham, which improved to 3-0, as Arinze Iloka, Jacob Kouroume, Luca deStasio and Fulvio deStasio all found the back of the net. Fulvio had two assists, while Luca and Uzo Iloka each had one assist.
